<b>21/6 Sunday</b>	<b>8:00 pm</b>	<b>Uganda Rising 82 minutes</b>	In a part of Uganda forgotten by the world, where civil war has been raging for two decades, everyday something remarkable happens. Children who have never known peace face the day as if to live this way is normal, as if they believe in a better future. This is the story of Uganda, her stolen children, and the fight to be free.
<b>22/6 Monday</b>	<b>7:50 pm</b>	<b>The Black Pimpernel 100 minutes</b>	The film is about Harald Edelstam, Sweden's ambassador to Chile, who after the military coup of Augusto Pinochet in 1973, managed to save the lives of more than 1,300 people by taking them to his embassy and transporting them to Sweden. What drove him, and what price did he end up paying for his total commitment?
<b>23/6 Tuesday</b>	<b>8:00 pm</b>	<b>The Devil Came on Horseback 85 minutes</b>	Using the exclusive photographs and first hand testimony of former U.S. Marine Captain Brian Steidle, THE DEVIL CAME ON HORSEBACK takes the viewer on an emotionally charged journey into the heart of Darfur, Sudan. Whilst working for the African Union, Steidle witnessed Sudan's Arab run government executing a plan to rid the province of its black African citizens. Ultimately frustrated by the inaction of the international community, Steidle resigned and returned to the US to expose the images and stories of lives systematically destroyed.

<b>25/6 Thursday</b>	<b>9:40 pm</b>	<b>New Year Baby 70 minutes</b>	Born on Cambodian New Year in a refugee camp, Socheata grew up in the United States not knowing about her family's past. In NEW YEAR BABY, she journeys to Cambodia to discover the secrets of how her family came together during the Khmer Rouge rein. She finds out what her parents hid in shame also proves their great heroism. Winner of the 2007 Amsterdam International Film Festival Movies That Matter Award.
<b>26/6 Friday</b>	<b>8:00 pm</b>	<b>Screamers 90 minutes</b>	Multi-platinum, Grammy-award winning rock band, System of a Down's critically acclaimed political tour movie, is an impassioned synthesis of concert film and political expose about the rock group's intensely personal campaign to stop genocide. Chronicling the band's efforts to persuade both the British and U.S. governments to recognize the Armenian genocide, Screamers also traces the history of modern-day genocide - and genocide denial - from the first occurrence in the 20th century in Turkey, to today in Darfur.
